VANDALISM & CRIME IN LA FORTINA

If you think you and your home is safe from the crime and vandalism going on in the community, think again. Vandalism & Crime has only increased in our area over the last year. During the summer months we had numerous vehicles broken into and a few homes were even burglarized. The neighboring Community to the South—Crismon Crossing has been hit with burglaries too.

Recently the Vandalism has become much worse. We have had graffiti on the outer common walls, graffiti on the gate call box, the back gate was rammed into and had to be repaired and the back pedestrian gate has continuously been vandalized. The antennas on both gates have been stolen and/or damaged and the front gate call box LCD plate was smashed and broken. The vandalism that is occurring to the gates and common areas is costing all of us money! Police reports have been filed and we are looking for information on the vandals so we may prosecute. Your help is needed!

Everyone in our community needs to keep a lookout for any suspicious vehicles and persons in our neighborhood. If you see a car prowler or any other suspicious criminal activity occurring, please call 911 immediately.

Let's show these vandals & burglars that they are not welcome in our Neighborhood!

What is Neighborhood Watch?

Neighborhood Watch is simply a program of neighbors watching out for each other during the workday, evenings, vacations or any other absence. The purpose of the Neighborhood Watch program is to create an alert neighborhood by using simple crime prevention methods. The program works through the mutual aid of neighbors watching the property of other neighbors. This has several advantages, including the fact that your neighbors know who you are, what type of car you drive, and who belongs, as a rule, at your residence.

Why Have a Neighborhood Watch?

Catching burglars and recovering stolen goods for victims is a long and tedious process. Most residential burglaries occur during the day between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. while people are at work. Burglars will scope the neighborhood prior to Breaking into a home and if there is any sign that others can see what they are doing, they will move on to another neighborhood. They don't want to risk getting caught. One way to prevent this from happening to you or your neighbors is by organizing a Neighborhood Watch Program.

La Fortina's Neighborhood Watch

We are in need of ten more Neighborhood Watch Captains for the community. The more Neighborhood Watch teams that we organize, the better protected our community is. Neighborhood Watch is based on neighbors watching out for neighbors. The more neighbors we have watching out for each other and our homes, the safer La Fortina will be.

So far, only ONE Neighborhood Watch party has taken place. Congrats to the EL MORO block for having successfully formed a block watch and for holding their first meeting/BBQ. Many THANKS goes out to the Neighborhood Captain Jessica Filograsso and her Co-Captain Katie Winfield for all of their effort in getting their block party together.
